AREA OF CONSIDERATION

Current Lieutenant Colonels (MOS Immaterial) in the Rhode Island Army National Guard who meet all criteria listed in the qualification requirements below. Only open to eligible traditional M-Day or Technician Soldiers in the Rhode Island Army National Guard.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have battalion-level or above staff experience and be able to demonstrate proficiency in staff processes, particularly in the Military Decision-Making Process (MDMP). Furthermore, candidates must have completed the Advanced Operations Course (AOC), ensuring they have received the requisite training and education to excel in high-level military planning and leadership roles. Serve a minimum of 36 months; have a current Periodic Health Assessment (within 12 months); a passing Army Combat Fitness Test (within 12 months) and not be under a current suspension of favorable personnel actions or required to be under suspension (IAW AR 600-8-2), even if suspension has not been imposed.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Must be available to interview on a date and time to be determined at the Cranston Readiness Center, 645 New London Avenue, Cranston, RI 02920. **Uniform is the Operational Camouflage Pattern Duty Uniform.** Soldiers will be contacted by phone for notification of date and time for the interview.

PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Primarily responsible for supervising and synchronizing staff efforts, including special staff. Acts as the principal agent for the commander for the coordination and approval of command policies, plans, orders, instructions, and procedures. Assists the Brigade Commander in ensuring the Brigade's readiness for its federal and state mission now and into the future. As required, informs and advises the staff and subordinate commands of the commander's intent, guidance, and policies. Receives the commander's decisions and directives and ensures timely implementation. Ensures information flow, provides feedback to the commander, and ensures the staff conducts long-range planning. Responsible for acting and making decisions in the commander's absence.
